Mla Citation For A Textbook - MLA (Modern Language Association) style is most commonly used to write papers and cite sources within the liberal arts and humanities. This resource, updated to reflect the MLA Handbook (8 th ed.), offers examples for the general format of MLA research papers, in-text citations, endnotes/footnotes, and the Works Cited page.

How to Cite a Textbook Source in an MLA Format. For example: The Textbook's Title, 2nd ed. Include the abbreviation "ed." or "eds." if your textbook has an editor (s) instead of an author; include that information after the editor or editors' names. For example: Doe, Jane, ed. Or: Doe, John and Jane Doe, eds.

How to Cite a Book Online in MLA. Include the same information as a regular book. Add as much as the original publication information as possible. After citing the original publication information, add the electronic publication information.

How to Cite a Textbook - Method 2 Using MLA Style Start with the author's full name, last name first. Provide the title of the textbook. Give the article or chapter title if necessary. Include publication information. List the medium of publication. Use the author-page style for in-text ...
